Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

We have all experienced it sometime; we've seen someone broke down or out of gas on the side of the road. In our heart the Holy Spirit tells us to pull over, lend assistance, and present the gospel so this person has the opportunity to accept Christ. I must confess that often times I listen to my flesh and make excuses why I cannot stop and end up grieving the Spirit. Recently though, a young woman from the Gila (Hee-lu) Indian Reservation ran out of gas just in front of us as we were pulling out of the church driveway. Thank God that He gave me one more shot and convicted both Michelle's and my heart and we stopped. Fortunately, it did not take me long to figure out the problem and I left to get gas. Michelle however, got out of the car (while it was stopped) and began talking to the girl while I was gone. It turned out the lady was going through a difficult time and needed to talk to someone. Michelle listened, but also took the opportunity to share with the woman that she was parked in front of a church building with people who would love her and wanted to help her. More importantly Michelle was able to give her the Gospel and share with her that there is a God that loves her more than anyone and He wants to save her if she'll believe and ask Him to. Regretfully, as far as we know the girl has not been back and she did



not make a Profession of Faith that day. However, Michelle and I both believe that event was a "Divine Appointment". I sometimes wonder why God would have us park our camper at a church in the middle of an alfalfa field, surrounded by dairy farms, not far from an Indian Reservation, where we lost water and electricity one day because a tractor snagged our lines. I believe I got my answer that November morning, God knew that woman was struggling and burdened down and He wanted to tell her possibly for the last time that He loves her. So He drained her fuel tank and sent two Believers out to help her and give her the message. We thank God for

using undeserving sinners like us and hope He continues to in the future.

Since the last time I wrote we left Michigan in September stopping at churches in Indiana, Iowa, and Oklahoma along the way to Arizona. We participated in a round robin Missions Conference in Central Utah and spent all of November in Arizona attending meetings we made last spring. By the graciousness of God we are now at 43% and feel like we are making some real headway. Please pray for an "unspoken request" of ours (if you want to know I will tell you), we are asking God to do a real miracle and hope you will do the same. We also ask that you please continue to pray that God would give us boldness to share the gospel with those we encounter and that God would use us to see more people accept Christ as their Savior. Pray the Holy Spirit will direct us to partner with the right churches and for our safety as we travel to meetings, that we can leave for Palau as soon as possible, and that God would be preparing the Palauan people's hearts to receive us and the Gospel.
